# A Skills-based Education Plan details the skills and knowledge you want to or need to acquire for:

- Your chosen career
- Your lifestyle

A Student Education Plan details the courses you need to take for your degree or credential

## A SEP is a **subset** of a Skills-based Education Plan


It is the list and order of courses required for completion of a credential in college or another formal post-secondary setting
