Importance of the seamless transition

- Achieving the student "seamless transition" as they matriculate from high school to college has alluded educators for decades.
- For high schools that adopt the 4-year GFSF program, students will arrive at college with a well-crafted and researched 10-year career & life Plan as well as a Skills-based Education Plan.
- As colleges re-imagine student services and pathways, it will be vital to have high school colleagues at the table.
- Building strong relationships takes time and effort, but so worth it!



Barriers to establishing relationships and student pathways.....

- Must have a strategy
- Need to meet with decision-makers
- Begin with the easiest place to start—converting existing CTE articulation agreements into what might be a college Guided Pathway
- All students need effective and comprehensive (not online surveys) career exploration in order to succeed—trying to build without it, will set everyone back.
- Must be willing to work through something together in order to pilot and test.



Importance to STUDENTS of the K12-tocollege collaboration

- Everything we do should keep students at the focus and forefront
- ▶ It's important for each educational institution (high school and college) to think and plan for what's best for students BEYOND their doors:
 - ► For high schools—the journey with your students isn't over at graduation. They need effective matriculation
 - ► For colleges—the journey with your students isn't over at credential completion or commencement. They need help in transitioning to the workplace or transfer.
