

Statewide, less than half of all incoming students earn a degree, certificate, or complete a successful transfer outcome within 6 years.

With consistent gaps in completion found for African-American, Hispanic, Native American, and Pacific Islander students





Call to Action

Bold changes are needed to improve completion rates, narrow the achievement gap, and keep pace with an economy that is increasingly demanding more college-educated workers.

Integrates support services in ways that make it easier for students to get the help they need during every step of their community college experience.








Guided Pathways Landscape in CA

- \$150 million in one-time funds, five-year time horizon
- Voluntary participation (all 114 colleges submitted self-assessments and work plans last year)
- Builds on IEPI to create system-wide infrastructure to support Guided Pathways
- Provides capacity-building through centralized professional development and technical assistance
- Expects college progress towards Guided Pathways implementation by early 2020s




During fall 2017, 80% of CCC reported being in the pre- or early adoption phase of Guided Pathways





Over half of CCCs do not have strong systematic coordination and pipeline alignment efforts






Serving Kern County

- Wonderful Graduated first cohort spring 2018









Pathways Enrollment (2013-2018)











Sample HS Plan


