Since 2009, Santa Barbara City College has collaborated with the Carpinteria and Santa Barbara School Districts to deliver a successful Dual Enrollment Freshman Transition (DEFT)* course on high school campuses. Today, the student-centered 10-year Plan developed in this course is a graduation requirement for the Santa Barbara high schools. It was determined that to most effectively impact student success, structured annual updates to each student's online 10-year Plans were desirable and, in 2012, the expansion of efforts to the 10th, 11th, and 12th grades began.

This past fall, the first cohort of DEFT students to graduate brought their 10-year Plans to SBCC. Students' plans will be used for academic coaching and counseling, to inform student education plans (SEPS), and to help students stay on track for timely completion of a degree, certificate, or transfer to a university.
