Overview of Start-up Professional Development Commitment

- 1. **January 7 and 8, 2016:** Principal, Lead Teacher, and School Site Executive (SSE) attend GFSF conference in Santa Barbara
- 2. **January 27 (3 PM)**: Webex meeting for principals
- 3. **February 1 to March 15**: GFSF Program and Curriculum Specialist (PCS)/TAP works with Lead Teacher to conduct "buy-in" meetings on each campus that is part of the GFSF evaluation
- 4. Late February: School leaders attend 2 different orientation webinars
- 5. **March:** For freshman course instructors, complete the *Self-Study Quick Start* process (8 to 12 hours of individualized work) under the direction of the regional GFSF PCS
- **6. Mid-April:** Webinar series for School Site Executives (SSE) Overview and management of My10yearPlan.com®
- 7. **April:** For freshman course instructors, attend advanced 2-day implementation workshops
- **8. July 17-19, 2016:** A school-site team (noted below) for each school attends the Focus on Freshmen (FOF) conference for in-depth, advanced professional development (with a pre-conference meeting the evening of July 16 and a post-conference meeting immediately following the closing conference luncheon)
- 9. **August/September:** School-wide meeting for all personnel at which school team presents an overview of their *Get Focused...Stay Focused!* ™ program plans

Building the Capacity of the Freshman Course Instructors

GFSF Program and Curriculum Specialists will provide the professional development and technical assistance for the schools that have been chosen to implement the GFSF program beginning in Fall 2016.

With all the resources provided in the workshops, webinars, and conferences outlined here, along with the *Get Focused...Stay Focused!* ™ *Program and Instructional Manual*, participants will be equipped to go back to their schools to launch a GFSF program that promotes student success and high school/college completion for ALL students.

February 1 to March 15

Site visits by the TAPS and GFSF PCS with their individual GFSF schools

Agenda for these site visit days:

The 1-hour buy-in presentation with the school committee assigned to the project. After this presentation the school reports out where they are in the process.

Following this presentation, the GFSF PCS meets with the principal to review the *Administrator's Checklist* (*Get Focused...Stay Focused!* $^{\text{TM}}$ *Program and Instructional Manual*, page 3/34) and review the 10-Step Plan for Implementing a Get Focused...Stay Focused! $^{\text{TM}}$ Initiative (Get Focused...Stay Focused! $^{\text{TM}}$ Program and Instructional Manual, page 3/2).

At this point, if they haven't already done so, the principal should choose a Lead Teacher. Review the Lead Teacher Job Description with the principal (*Get Focused...Stay Focused!* ™ *Program and Instructional Manual*, pages 3/39 to 3/40).

Assessments documents are due no later than April 1, 2016.

The freshman course instructors (once they have completed the *Self-Study Quick Start Guide* assignment above) will meet with a certified trainer for a 2-day advanced implementation workshop to finalize their lesson plans and course strategies so they are ready to launch an effective course that is implemented with fidelity from the first day of class. This will include time for planning and for rolemodeling delivery of the course content. Also participants should have time to explore My10yearPlan.com®.

Preliminary Planning and Implementation Professional Development – Year Two Implementing the School-wide Initiative with the Follow-up Modules and Counseling/Academic Coaching Strategies

Overview of Follow-up Module and School-wide Initiative Professional Development Commitment (2017)

- 1. **January 2017:** Principal, Lead Teacher, and English Department Chair attend GFSF conference in Santa Barbara
- 2. **February 1 to March 15**: Regional GFSF Program and Curriculum Specialist works with Lead Teacher and English Department Chair to finalize strategies for Fall 2017rollout of the follow-up modules
- 3. **Late March:** Follow-up course instructors attend 2 different orientation webinars
- 4. **March/April:** Follow-up course instructors complete a *Self-Study Quick Start Guide* (8 to 12 hours of individualized work) under the direction of the regional GFSF Program and Curriculum Specialist

- 5. **April/May:** Follow-up course instructors, under the direction of the Regional GFSF Curriculum and Program Specialist, attend an advanced implementation workshop.
- **6. July:** A school-site team for each school attends the Focus on Freshmen (FOF) conference for more in-depth, advanced professional development
- 7. **August/September 2017:** 1-day school-wide meeting for all personnel computer lab-based breakout sessions to introduce the online 10-year Plan and how to use it for advisory and academic coaching functions.

Between January 2017 and December 2018

- 1. GFSF Program and Curriculum Specialist will be available for phone consultations, hosting webinars as well as site visits.
- 2. Monthly webinar meetings will continue for all freshman course instructors for the purpose of capacity building, to touch base, and to share experiences.
- 3. Quarterly webinar meetings of Lead Teachers from all evaluation sites to share experiences and brainstorm next steps.
- 4. Principal retreat: During the summer of 2017 and the summer of 2018, a one-day meeting in Santa Barbara at UCSB for all principals to discuss research findings (both quantitative and qualitative) and brainstorm program enhancement strategies. (Superintendents will be invited but their attendance is not mandatory).

Cost Sharing

The lion's share of the cost of the above PD will be borne by the GFSF nonprofit and their public partner, Academic Innovations, until such time that supplemental funding can be found. This includes the technical assistance services by a GFSF program and curriculum specialist, the cost of trainers and the registration fees for any workshops or conference are carried by any grant supporting this evaluation.

Substitutes for personnel involved in the require professional development, along with transportation, hotels, per diems for required travel costs by school site personnel will be borne by the school district.
