- 2.9% of 9th graders dropping out


Planning and Implementation


- Follow The George Washington University's 10-Step Plan for Implementing a Freshman Transition Initiative
- Use Career Choices as the curriculum
- Require all freshmen to take:
 - · Composition/English
 - · Transitions to Math/Algebra
 - · World Geography/Integrated Science
 - Education for Careers (Career Choices)/Basic Computer Applications
- Limit class size to 25 students or fewer
- Assign a counselor and academic dean to work only with the 9th graders (300 students)
- Hand-pick 9th grade teachers and provide them with comprehensive professional development
- Establish the mottos, "Failure is not an option" and "Strive for an 'A' Everyday"
- Require a collective agreement to maintaining consistency and establishing rewards and consequences





